Dear Parents,

September has seen students really begin to apply themselves to their new academic year's subjects and requirements. ECA's also began in earnest, and we are pleased that we have been able to offer more separate and unique ECA's than ever before!

Teachers have been carefully monitoring progress during this time period, allowing us to assess each student's strengths and areas for improvement. I would like to take this opportunity to mention some of the school programs that will begin from term 2. Each of these will further highlight and improve your child's academic and social success:

- 1. Our English as an Additional Language (EAL) program begins in Term 2: Rigorous testing and analysis has helped the EAL team identify which students do not yet meet their year level requirements for English. These students will be placed in an intensive supplementary program to help aid their English Language development.
- 2. Our English Only Policy also kicks off in term. This is a policy whereby students are encouraged to practice their English Speaking skills throughout the school, in all public spaces, not just within the confines of the English lessons. This is a policy that has been proven successful in aiding in increased speaking proficiency, and we look forward to the positive impact it will have.

3. We will also begin our new House Team System. Named for the 4 sacred animals of Vietnam; Dragon, Phoenix, Turtle and Unicorn, this new system will allow students to compete not just on the sport's fields, but also every day in the classroom. Students will be awarded with points on a consistent basis, based on how well they perform in all tasks related to our School-Wide Learner.

Goals (SWLG's), and points will be tallied on a weekly, monthly and yearly basis for regular and appropriate rewards. We are excited for the challenges and opportunities this presents for students to showcase their talents day to day!

More on each of these school wide improvements will be presented in a more indepth letter to parents, to be released shortly.
