For the Integrated Program, the award is called Academic Champion

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Award – English and is awarded to the highest overall academic result for the school year in English for each integrated class in Years 1 – 5 and English and EPP for each integrated class in Years 6 - 9. The overall result must be 85% or above.

Please allow me to note a few items that will ensure the continued smooth functioning of our school:

Pick-up: Students are meant be picked up from school at the conclusion of their academic day as staff supervision is not available late in the day. In the rare event that parents are not able to pick up their child promptly, they should contact the Office.

Parents on campus – parents are invaluable as co-educators, and we are most fortunate to have a dedicated, involved parent community.
