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### Dear KIK Families,

What an exciting week in our Kindergarten classes! Our space-themed month include fun hands-on activities, crafts, sensory play, and educational lessons that spark our young leaners' curiosity about the universe.

We started the month with a discussion about our **Earth planet**. The children shared what they know about Earth, learned new facts, and discovered ways to help protect it by planting more trees, putting trash in the bins, turning off the taps while we brush our teeth and walking short distances instead of driving.



For the second week of April, we explored cool facts about **The Sun and the Moon** and focused on how the Sun affects the Earth. We conducted a fun experiment using a torch to represent the Sun, showing how it is daytime on one side of the Earth while it is nighttime on the other. We also sorted activities and animals that are for day and night.



In the following week, our little explorer students discover the key facts about **The Planets** in the solar system, their names and their order. It was very interesting to know which planet is closest to the sun and which one is the furthest.





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The last week of the moth was dedicated to **Spaceships & Astronauts**. We learnt about astronauts and the job they do in space. We also discovered that there is no gravity in space and that everything floats in air.

During the month, the children read exciting stories about space adventures, watched short videos about astronauts and space missions and engaged in various space-themed crafts. They made colorful planets, starry night skies, and even created their own constellations. These activities helped them understand more about the wonders of space while having lots of fun.

This was a fantastic month full of activities and learning, and we cannot wait for May to bring even more fun and learning!
